Helen Harvey, 81, A Theatrical Agent

Helen Harvey, a New York theatrical agent who in her 50-year career represented some of the most important playwrights, directors and designers, died on Monday at Hartford Hospital in Connecticut. She was 81 and lived in New Milford, Conn.

For many years at the William Morris Agency, and then with her own agency, Helen Harvey Associates, Ms. Harvey was known for her artistic standards and her negotiating ability. Her clients included Edward Albee, Neil Simon, Peter Stone, Jose Quintero, Daniel Sullivan and Douglas W. Schmidt.

She was born in Huntington, W. Va., attended Bryn Mawr College and graduated from Ohio State University. After working as a theatrical secretary, Ms. Harvey became assistant to Alfred de Liagre Jr. She then moved to the Music Corporation of America.

She is survived by a daughter, Sarah Douglas of Brooklyn; two sons, James Linkoff of Salt Lake City and Frank Linkoff of Manhattan, and seven grandchildren.
